BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

SWAMI VIVEKANAND COLLEGE OF EDUCATION, TARKWARI came into existence by the efforts of Swami Vivekanand Educational Society and the courtesy of H.P. Government, H.P. University and NCTE Jaipur. The college started functioning from Oct. 3, 2000.

Swami Vivekanand College of Education, Tarkwari is located at a distance of about 25 km from Hamirpur. It is about 12 kms from Jahu on Hamirpur road and 20 km from Sarkaghat. It can be reached from the places by first coming to Bhot, Hamirpur or Jahu as is suitable to an individual. From these places there are buses for Tarkwari after every 15 or 20 minutes. There is regular bus service to the place from all important stations like Mandi, Shimla, Una, Hamirpur and New Delhi.

The College has a well-equipped library with large number of standard books, both on education and general subjects. It has a spacious reading room with sitting capacity of 150 students. College subscribes to important magazines, journals and number of newspapers. There are encyclopedias besides other reference books, books & book bank. It is managed by a well qualified librarian.

The College is proud of having good computer laboratory which has sufficient number of computers and allied equipment. Computer training with basic language is provided to students by a computer teacher. Practical teaching of computer is given to each student. Computer trainers are qualified computer expert with vast experience of concerned area.

Special attention is paid to the physical fitness of the students. College authority venture participation of all students in games & athletic meets. Special emphasis is on to build the self confidence of the students. They are encouraged to participate in declamation contests, debates, educational seminars, conferences etc. Morning assembly is organized on every day of the week.

In the previous year participation of our students in declamation contest, Athletics etc. was considerable. They brought laurels to the college by their excellent performance and winning position in debates, declamation contest, and Athletic meets at state level.

Admission Procedure :

Admission to B.Ed. course is done on the basis of Merit in the Entrance test and counseling conducted by H.P. University, Shimla. In this case, the students of General category are to fulfil the conditions of 50% marks in graduation/post Graduation & 45% marks of SC/ST in Graduation/Post Graduation. The selected students are required to report to this college for filling up of their admission forms and for confirmation of the admission. The Management seats will only be filled up after the seats of normal admission are over.

Objectives of D.El.Ed. Programme

Objectives of D.El.Ed. Programme are given in the following points:

- ✦ Understand the nature of education as discipline/area of study.
- ✦ To encourage understanding of the basic concepts/issues of education especially with reference to the kind of concerns that NCF, 2005 has raised in the context of understanding oriented teaching.
- ✦ Understand how concepts theories/issue drawn from discipline cognate to education. I.e. Psychology, Sociology, Philosophy, Economics and Management etc : could be used/practiced suitably in perspectives of teaching-learning in school.
- ✦ Appreciate the challenge of theorizing education and identify relationship between theory and practices.
- ✦ Understand the need of teacher education in the contest of changing needs of school education.
- ✦ Learn the skills required for playing a leadership role in different areas of school education.
- ✦ Understand the need between education and national research.
- ✦ Gain an understanding on child psychology and the process of learning.
- ✦ Develop a rational conceptualization technology to teaching-learning and training and transaction.
- ✦ Develop skill among students to manage internships practices.
- ✦ Develop competency among students through the development of curricula syllabus text books and instructional material, evaluation and assessment.
- ✦ Develop ability to analyse and reflect professional experience.

The Scheme of Examination for Course D.El.Ed.

The scheme of examination and courses for D.El. Ed. Course is according to the syllabus laid down by the H.P. Board of School Education, Dharamshala. The medium of instructions and examination is Hindi & English. Candidate shall be required to take the following courses :-

Scheme of Examination for D.El.Ed.-I

1. There shall be annual examination system.
2. Medium of examination (Both Hindi and English).
3. The question shall be set both in Hindi and English medium except for teaching of languages.
4. The candidate is required to pass the courses provided that candidate who appears in examination and fails in not more than 50% of the courses shall be declared as re-appear and shall be required to appear in only those courses and will have two changes available to him/her to clear his/her re-appear. The candidates who fail in more than 50% courses shall be declared fail and shall be required to appear in all the courses as a private candidates at the time of annual examination.
5. The aggregate marks obtained by a candidates in the Diploma in Education, examination shall be show separately for theory, school experience and work experience.

Scheme of Examination for D.El.Ed.-II

1. There shall be annual examination system.
2. Medium of examination (Both Hindi and English).
3. The questions shall be set both in Hindi and English medium except for teaching of languages.
4. The candidates are required to pass all the courses provided that candidate who appears in examination and fails in not more than 50% of the course shall be declared as re-appear and shall be required to appear in only those courses and will have two chances available to him/her to clear his/her re-appear. The candidate who fails in more than 50% courses shall be declared fail and shall be required to appear in all the course and external at the time of annual examination.
5. The aggregate marks obtained by a candidate in the Diploma in Education, examination shall be shown separately for theory, school experience and work experience.

Necessary Conditions

The following conditions will be applicable for two years D.El.Ed. Course Session 2015-17 as prescribed by the Govt of Himachal Pradesh.

1. 90% attendance would be necessary in the D.El. Ed. training course.
2. 45% will be the pass marks in D.El. Ed. Examinations of the 1st year and 2nd year.
3. In case the trainees take leave of medical grounds/meternity purpose then the training may be extended by the duration of leave taken.
4. During the training, the candidates would not pursue any other educational course/study either regular or through distance mode.
5. The D.El.Ed. Course is only an academic course. Passing of D.El. Ed. Course successfully does not confer any vested right the candidates for appointment in Government job.

General Rules

1. All the students are required to attend at least minimum prescribed teaching days of the session. Students failing to fulfil this condition shall not be eligible for the University Examination.
 2. A student is required to attend at least minimum prescribed teaching days of the session. The Principal shall have the authority to withdraw his/her name from the University Examination/Board Examination.
 3. At any time, during the course of training, the Principal may at his/her own discretion can remove the name of a student from the College rolls if he/she fails to make progress in studies or found guilty of misconduct.
 4. A student who wishes to withdraw from the college must do so formally but fee once deposited is not refundable.
 5. Participation in curricular, co-curricular activities and games is compulsory for all students.
 6. No student is allowed to accept any kind of employment during the course of training. If so his/her candidature will be cancelled from the College Roll.
 7. Rules regarding discipline, payment of fees, grant to leave and use of library must be strictly observed.
 8. The Principal has the power at his/her own discretion to impose fine.
 9. During the training period, no student shall attend or take part in any anti-Government, Anti-College or any other subversive activities.
 10. Political and unauthorised meetings, demonstrations of all kinds, sale and organised distribution of books, pamphlets, posters in the college premises are strictly prohibited. Defaulters will be punished severely.
 11. Misconduct shall be severely dealt with and may result in rustication or expulsion.
 12. Any breach of College discipline and long absence without leave shall be punishable to the extent of expulsion.
 13. Every student is required to keep with him the Identity card issued by the college authority & will provide the same on demand.
 14. Since, College work is regulated mostly through notices put on the Notice Board, students must look at the Notice Board at least twice in a day, once on the commencement of the day and later before their departure from the college. Ignorance of the notice shall not be entertained as an excuse for noncompliance.
 15. Smoking, drug, alcohol is strictly prohibited in the college premises.
 16. The students present in the college premises can leave the premises only after seeking prior written permission of the principal after the recommendation of the group mentor.
 17. Use of Mobile in side the class room is strictly prohibited.
- Working/Teaching Days :
- (a) B.Ed. :The pupil-teachers are required to complete 80% attendance for theory courses and 90% for field attachment school Internship/practice teaching. These shall be atleast 100 working days in each semester exclusive of the period of examinations and admissions.
 - (b) There shall be at last 100 working days in each semester exclusive of the period of examination and admission.
 - (c) D.El.Ed. The trainees are required to complete 90% attendance out of the minimum prescribed total number of 240 teaching days.

Leave Rules

1. If a student remains absent without prior sanction of leave for more than 10 days continuously, his/her name is liable to be struck off from the College rolls. However, he/she may seek re-admission by applying to the Principal. The Principal has the discretion to impose fine for that purpose. This will not be ordinarily allowed unless the Principal is fully satisfied that the circumstances leading to the absence without leave of the student concerned were beyond the control and absence was justified.

2. Leave from the college upto one day will be granted by the tutor. Leave for more than one day will be granted by the principal on the recommendation of the tutor. An application for leave shall be entertained.
3. The students who remain absent themselves without leave on days immediately preceding or following the Autumn, Spring or Winter break will have to pay a special fine of Rs. 40/-per day.

House Examination Rules:

1. One Compulsory House Tests in addition to the monthly tests will be held during semesters.
2. Absentees will be imposed fine Rs. 200/- for every paper.
3. If a student absents himself/herself from any of the house tests held by the College for purpose of internal assessment or fails in the house tests, the Principal shall have the authority to withhold or withdraw such student from the University/Board/Examination.
4. Students must extend full co-operation to the supervisory staff. Any student found guilty of using unfair means during the examination will be punished according to the seriousness of the offence.
5. Any candidate found guilty of using unfair means in the University examination will not be entitled to get character certificate. In such situation he/she will lose the right to be awarded with character certificate.
6. Although progress reports embodying the results of house examination are forwarded to the parents/guardians by the college office. It is the responsibility of every student to bring his/her result to the notice of their parents/guardians.

Library Rules :

1. The library books may be retained by the students upto a period of 14 days after that these must be returned or get re-issued, depending on the discretion of the Librarian. A fine of Rs. 30/- per volume per day is charged for the books kept for more than two week after the date of issue.
2. If a book at the time of returning to Library is found defaceted or damaged in anyway, the last borrower will be required to pay its price as damaged.
3. Leave from the college does not imply exemption from the return of library books. The books may be returned to the library by post under registered cover, if necessary.
4. The students are expected to observe perfect silence in the library and are expected not to disturb others in any way.
5. Non-transferable Library-cum-identity card is issued to all the students and books are issued on this card. Students must get the identity cards within a month after paying their dues of admission after which no card will be issued. Two copies of their passport size photographs should be handed over to the Librarian. Loss of the card should immediately be reported to the Librarian who will issue a duplicate card on payment of Rs. 25/- only.
6. Maximum Three books can be borrowed from the library at a time.
7. Student's responsibility will not be over until the books are shown as returned on the library card. They are advised to be very careful in getting the signature of the librarian on their cards while returning the books.
8. Books borrowed from the library must be returned to the librarian and no. books will be passed on to other students at their own.
9. Books reserved for the staff members and reference books, Text books, current periodicals will not be issued except consultation within the library.

The institution expects its scholars to observe the code of conduct laid down for college students and to inculcate a habit of discipline in them during their stay in the college. This will ultimately shape them into responsible and useful citizens of India.

The College Students must keep in mind the following points.:

1. The College lays special emphasis on the maintenance of discipline and necessary decorum in and outside the class rooms. A Disciplinary Committee is formed for the purpose.
2. Students are expected to be courteous and polite in their dealing with each other and with and employees of the College.
3. Proper respect should be shown to the teachers and their instructions should be carried out strictly.
4. Perfect silence should be maintained in the classes, in the reading room and in the verandas so that none is disturbed in studies and the atmosphere prevailing in the College remains academic.

5. Movement from one classroom to another should be orderly. At the end of a period, the incoming students should wait outside till the classroom has been completely vacated.
6. The students should understand that the College property is an asset of the nation and as such its maintenance is as much their duty as that of the administration. Therefore, let not any one disfigure or damage the furniture or deface the wall with pen, pencil or chalk marks.
7. In a vacant period, students are advised to utilize their time in the study of magazines, journals and newspapers in the reading room.
8. Students should inculcate the queue habit while they go to see the principal, to pay dues in the Account office, to get books issued from the Library, etc.
9. During their stay in the College, students are advised not to make use of ornaments, cosmetics, etc.
10. The students found guilty of infringement to the above rules of conduct and discipline shall liable be punished in the form of fine, withdrawal of concessions and stipends, or even expulsion from the college, depending on the seriousness of the offence.
11. Toilets/Bath rooms for staff and girls are separate. These must be used as such.

DRESS CODE :

Code of Conduct

1. All the students are expected to greet their college teachers when they meet them whether they teach them or not.

NSS Programmes

National Service Scheme has two types of programmes – Regular Activities and Special Camping Programmes. Students enrolled as NSS Volunteers are expected to work in the scheme for a period of two years and also participate in Special Camping Programmes of 7 days duration. The operational aim of NSS is to integrate the three basic components of the programme. NSS programme should provide a variety of learning experiences which must develop a sense of participation, service and achievement among the volunteers. The activities should aim at the following:-

1. Making education more relevant to the present situation to meet the felt needs of the community and supplement the education of the university/college students by bringing them face to face with the rural situation;
 2. Providing opportunities to the students to play their role in planning and executing development projects which would not only help in creating durable community assets in rural areas and urban slums but also results in the improvement of quality of life of the economically weaker sections of the community;
 3. Encouraging students and non – students to work together along with the adults in rural areas;
 4. Developing qualities of leadership by discovering the latent potential among the campers, both students as well as local youth (Rural and Urban), with a view to involving them more intimately in the development programme and also ensuring proper maintenance of the assets created during the camps;
 5. Emphasizing dignity of labour and self – help and the need for combining physical work with intellectual pursuits;
 6. Encouraging youth to participate enthusiastically in the process of national development and promote national integration through corporate living and cooperative action.
- While undertaking these activities, each NSS unit should envisage its programmes/activities aimed at instilling discipline, building character, promotion of physical fitness and development of culture.

Regular Activities

The aim of the National Service Scheme is education through community service. It offers the youth wonderful opportunities to help the poor and the weaker sections. It undertakes social service activities, work camps, and conducts social awareness classes, socio-economic surveys and leadership camps.

The NSS unit has been successfully functioning in the College. Membership to the NSS is voluntary but strictly selective. There are self –financing NSS units of 100 members each. Applications for enrolment are called for by the programme officers of the units at the beginning of each academic year. Membership in the NSS and certificate to that effect from the university will be treated as additional qualification while making recruitments to public services. The aim of the scheme is to create social awareness and personality development among the students.

Work camps, social service activities are organized on a regular basis. The Volunteers have to attend 240 hours of work and the 7-day special camp. Such students will be awarded grace marks and certificates by the Himachal Pradesh University.

Duration of this service is 120 hours i.e. 20 hours for orientation of NSS volunteers, 30 hours for campus work and 70 hours for community service.
